Participation Guidelines for the Scientific Conference:

1 – Originality of the Research and Scientific Methodology:

The research must be original and serious, prepared according to recognized academic scientific methodology, and must respect proper citation rules. It must not have been previously presented at another scientific conference, nor published wholly or partially in a scientific journal or conference proceedings. It must not be extracted from a doctoral thesis, a master's thesis, or a master's dissertation.

2 – Relevance to the Conference Themes:

The research topic must fall within one of the conference themes specified above. Any paper that does not comply with these themes will be rejected.

3 – Nature of Participation:

Participation must be individual only. Joint submissions are not accepted.

4 – Language of Papers and Abstracts:

Papers are accepted in three languages: Arabic, French, and English, provided that:

An abstract in Arabic must be attached if the paper is written in a foreign language (French or English).

An abstract in a foreign language (French or English) must be attached if the paper is written in Arabic.

The abstract must not exceed half a page and must include 3 to 5 keywords

- Font: *Simplified Arabic*, size 14 for Arabic language.
- Font: *Times New Roman*, size 12 for foreign languages.

6 – Length of the paper:

The paper must be between a minimum of 10 pages and a maximum of 20 pages, including references and appendices (if any).

7 – Compliance with the style:

Please respect the required deadlines for submitting papers. Failure to comply will result in the paper not being scheduled.

Preamble of the Conference

The right to litigate before the judiciary is considered one of the fundamental rights enshrined by the Algerian Constitution, as it represents the primary guarantee for the protection of rights and freedoms. Access to the courts remains the legitimate means for anyone who claims their rights have been violated or who has suffered injustice. However, the judicial reality in Algeria reveals several challenges that hinder the effective exercise of this right, most notably the accumulation of cases before the courts, which leads to delays in dispute resolution and slows the delivery of justice. Moreover, many court rulings are not practically enforced due to non-compliance by the parties, which often renders the judicial process ineffective.

With the development of economic and social transactions and the increasing complexity of relationships between individuals and institutions, it has become necessary for the Algerian legislator to seek alternative solutions to overcome these challenges and ensure greater judicial efficiency.

This development has led to the adoption of new dispute resolution mechanisms known as alternative methods, which aim to reduce the burden on the courts and achieve a rapid and effective settlement of disputes that satisfies the parties.

Among these methods, judicial mediation stands out as a flexible mechanism in which a neutral and independent party, known as the judicial mediator, assists the disputing parties in reaching an amicable solution that is acceptable to them and serves their interests. This ensures the stability of social and economic transactions. This mechanism is also characterized by its speed and by reducing pressure on the courts.

Despite the inclusion of judicial mediation in the Civil and Administrative Procedures Law No. 08-09, its practical implementation still faces several challenges, most notably the weakness of the legal framework, a shortage of qualified professionals, and a lack of societal awareness and supporting legal culture for this mechanism. Hence, there is a clear need to strengthen judicial mediation, whether through revising legal texts or developing practical practices within the judicial system.

Research Problem

In light of the above, the conference raises the following research question: To what extent has the Algerian legislator succeeded in embedding judicial mediation within the alternative justice system, and what legal and practical measures can enhance its role and ensure its effective implementation in practice?

Objectives of the Conference

Clarifying the fundamental concepts of judicial mediation and distinguishing it from other alternative dispute resolution mechanisms.

Analyzing the legal and regulatory framework of judicial mediation in Algeria.

Evaluating the reality of the application of judicial mediation in Algerian courts.

Studying the extent of Algerian society's acceptance of judicial mediation and the reasons for the weak recourse to it.

Discussing the role of judicial and social institutions in supporting and developing judicial mediation.

Proposing effective legal methods and mechanisms to strengthen the use of judicial mediation as a primary option for dispute resolution.
